Reply:

There was an influx of cases in the last quarter of 2008 and first quarter of 2009 due to economic downturn. This led to a drastic increase in the number of appointments for filing of cases for those few months. As a result, the waiting time from appointment to filing had been lengthened despite the deployment of more Tribunal officers. Nonetheless, it was still within the target of 30 days.

To cope with the sudden upsurge of cases, the listing arrangements were enhanced so that more efforts and time were put in by the judicial officers to handle extra cases for a period of time. In addition, more cases were adjourned, settled and withdrawn before the first hearing in 2009 when compared to 2008. As a result, the average waiting time was only slightly increased for 1 day from Filing of a Case to First Hearing.

The net effect is that the changes will bring about a less than \$500,000 increase in expenditure in 2010-11.

The increased provision of \$22.4 million for Programme (2) in 2010-11 is mainly due to the filling of some vacancies, salary increment, and increase in requirement for hire of services and general departmental expenses.

As at end of March 2010, a total of 18 Judges and Judicial Officers are appointed to offices outside the Judiciary. This number includes appointments to bodies concerned with law reform, legal education and the like outside the Judiciary.
